Below are the responses requested by the Grand Jury of San Luis Obispo County as contained in their report, "One Too Many" dated June 10, 2009.

1. Finding: The Grand Jury found that School Pool Safety Plans varied from comprehensive to almost nonexistent.

Response: Discussion will be conducted with the Superintendents of the school districts in the county that have swimming pools regarding the desirability of having more uniform pool safety plans for their schools. Also, assistance with developing the plans will be given by Schools Insurance Program for Employees (SIPE), the self-insured workers compensation program for all public schools in the county.


2. Finding: Recommend that the County Superintendent of Schools monitor school pool safety plans to ensure that each school district using a pool has adequate safety policies in place.

Response: Discussion will be conducted with the Superintendents of the school districts in the county that have swimming pools to determine the feasibility and costs of monitoring school pool safety plans for safety adequacy.

3. Finding: The San Luis Obispo County Superintendent of Schools.....should post a copy of this report where it will be available for public review.
